We held 97 prisoner in the month of July, and have a total of 470 prisoners held as of July 31, 2016.

We continue to have court 3 times a month, on Thursdays. Plans in the works to have another court day per month added to the court schedule for trials. More to follow.

Our compliment of Staff at the Loon Lake Detachment consists of 1 Sergeant, 1 Corporal, 7 Constables, and 2 Detachment Service Assistants (clerks). We have 5 guards/matrons. Highlights of the month of July were the capture of a drug dealer and the seizure of a large quantity of crystal meth, cocaine, marihuana, and cash. Also, another person of interest in the drug world/culture has been removed from the community due to a breach of court ordered documents. As well, our campgrounds have become the target of minor thefts of coolers and alcohol.

We continue to see the downtown core of the village over run with persons simply hanging around, some of those being intoxicated. Every effort is being made to rid the downtown of such issues. All of this stems around the bar. This, given the fact of the amount of intoxicated persons has become a priority for our Detachment, as seen by the increase of prisoners for the month of July.

We continue to be involved in the communities and schools we police, and are looking forward to the coming of the summer months. If any community functions are being planned, please let us know so we can participate.
