BYLAW No. 1/2013

A BYLAW TO PROHIBIT THE DEPOSIT, OF DIRT OR RUBBISH AND PREVENT THE OBSTRUCTION OF ROADS, STREET, SIDEWALKS,

The Council of the Village of Loon Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. No person shall throw, place, deposit or leave any dirt, stones, filth, dust or rubbish in any street, highway, lane, alley, sidewalk or other public place in the village.
2. No person shall obstruct any road, street, lane or sidewalk in the village by leaving a vehicle, building or other thing standing there on.
3. No person in charge of a truck, car, sled, or other vehicle shall permit it to stand upon any street longer than is necessary to transact business with the person opposite whose premises it stands; no person shall obstruct the free use of a street, lane, sidewalk or crossing by any other means.
4. No person shall stand in a group; sit or lounge on a chair, bench or thing in front of any place of public accommodation or entertainment or on any street or sidewalk so as to obstruct the free use of same by pedestrians.
5. No person or occupant of any premises shall allow any gate to swing over a sidewalk.
6. No person shall construct or erect any doorstep, porch, sign, gasoline pump, awning, railing or other thing which in any way encroaches upon a sidewalk or street.
7. No person shall place any goods, wares, merchandise, or articles of any kind upon any street or sidewalk, and no person shall expose any goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles outside any shop, warehouse or other building, which project over the sidewalk or street, but these provisions shall not be construed to interfere with the use of a portion of the sidewalk or street for a reasonable time during the taking in or delivery of goods, wares, merchandise or other articles.
8. No person shall unpack goods of any kind on a street or sidewalk in such manner that paper, sawdust or other packing material is deposited or remains upon any street or sidewalk.
9. No person shall throw or pile cordwood, firewood, or coal upon any sidewalk or on any street so as to obstruct the free use thereof.
10. Any person doing so shall, within twenty four hours after notification by council, remove such matter, and place the same on the village transfer site or other place designated in the notice; and

if the person neglects or refuses to do so, council may order the removal at the expense of the person in default. The payment of the expense shall not relieve the person in default from liability.

11. Any person found guilty of infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties provided in the general penalty bylaw of the village.
